Barbara Jo Green was born in El Dorado, AR, on September 30, 1947 and left this physical life on August 24, 2025, into the presence of her Best Friend, the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. She would share the gospel of Christ whenever she had the chance. She attended elementary and middle school in Birmingham, AL and graduated high school in Kenner, LA. Barbara Jo then attended and graduated from Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, LA with a Bachelor's Degree in Dietetics. She managed college food services for campuses in Lawton, Stillwater, Tulsa, OK and Las Vegas, NV. Upon moving to Texas, she attended Texas Woman's University to receive her Master's Degree in Science Education. She was a long-time Public School Educator teaching Middle School and High School Science, Physics and Chemistry. She loved it when students pursued science or engineering related fields as their chosen careers. For Barbara Jo, it was all about the students. Upon retiring from teaching, she then volunteered to tutor students who were struggling. When she found that there were no educators serving on the Forney ISD school Board where we live, she ran and served for nine years on the Board.

She loved her church, First Baptist Church Forney, where she served sharing the Gospel, working as a decision time counselor as well as working with the Hygiene Kit Ministry. This ministry was especially important to Barbara Jo as it supplied underprivileged students within the Forney ISD with basic hygiene supplies, enabling each student to feel better about themselves. Additionally, she served in many other areas during her life from teaching to singing and supporting wherever and whenever she could.

Barbara Jo is preceded in death by her father, Charles Jade Somervell, mother, Charlene Werna Mathews Somervell, brother, Stephen Owen Somervell and 4 miscarriages, each of which Barbara Jo was able to meet for the first time upon her arrival in Heaven.
