

Bill Welborn

December 9, 1931 - February 12, 2017

Billy Martin Welborn of Terrell, Tx passed away in his home early Sunday morning Feb. 12, 2017. He was preceded in death by his parents, Homer Elbert Welborn and Lois Jowell Welborn and his sister, Clara Nell Barron. Bill was born in Elmwood, Tx on Dec. 9, 1931 and grew up in Palestine, TX. He graduated from Gladewater High School after which he attended Nixon's Business College in Palestine. He completed the International Correspondence School's course for Lineman and Electricians and also Dale Carnegie's Effective Speaking and Human Relations Course. Bill married Iva Jean Douthit on Feb. 28, 1953 in Hope, Arkansas. He was drafted into the Army in December of 1952 and he re-enlisted into the regular Army the following March for 3 more years. He was in the 8198th Army unit and served as a Personnel Clerk in Matsushima, Japan and he received the National Defense Service Medal. After serving in the Army, Bill returned to his former job at Texas Power and Light Co. in Tyler. He was a lineman for a number of years and was promoted from Senior Lineman to Foreman. In 1968, he transferred to Athens to organize a new bucket crew. He was promoted to Assistant District Superintendent in Terrell in 1968 after which he was again promoted to District Distribution Superintendent and he served in that capacity until his retirement on August 1, 1987. Bill enjoyed fishing, hunting and camping. He loved to ride motorcycles as well as going on Saturday nights to watch stock car racing with family and friends. After retirement, Bill was a regular at the local coffee gatherings. He was a past President of the Terrell

Rifle and Pistol Club and a member of the Terrell Boat Club.

He is survived by his wife of 63 years, Iva Jean Welborn; son, Homer Welborn of Bellevue, WA; daughter Annette Valentine and husband, Tom, of Terrell; grandson, Tommy Valentine; granddaughter, Emily Jean Valentine, both of Terrell; sister, Mickey Vineyard and husband, Don, of Red Boiling Springs, TN, brother, Don Barton and wife Jan of Key Largo, FL as well as several nieces, nephews and cousins.

Funeral service will be at 3:00pm, Wednesday, February 15, 2017 at Max Slayton Funeral Chapel with the family receiving friends beginning at 2:00pm to service time. Bill will be laid to rest at Oakland Memorial Park in Terrell.

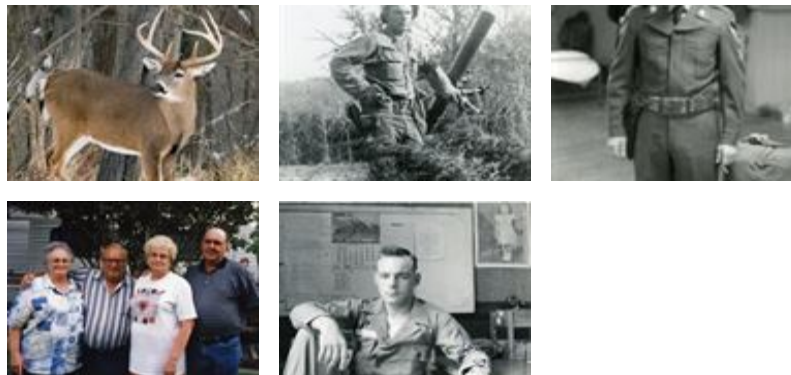
