I am so very sorry to hear about Colton's passing after a very long and brave battle.

I moved to Dallas 25 years ago this Nov. Colton and I first worked together in April 1999 on a long-term contract with JP Morgan Chase. We worked again on another long-term Chase project from March 2002 to May 2003. Even after the project ended we always kept in touch. He was like a brother to me (more so than my 2 younger brothers).

I will never forget his many stories he shared about Dallas and businesses before I moved here. We could be talking about something very obscure and he would have a humorous story.

He was a very dedicated and a person you could always learn on and trust.

During my aortic dissection in Oct 2014 my sister back in Albany, NY would call him every day to give Colton an update on my current state. Colton would then send off emails to over a dozen people we worked with providing the group with my current condition which at the time was touch and go.

I was medically induced into a 4 week coma after 13 hours of emergency surgery. When I woke up Colton was in my room.

I will always remember his many Texas Longhorn stories over the years. Most of all I will miss his friendship.

I am having surgery on Friday at UTSW and because of Covid restrictions I will be unable to attend his service.
