James Olin Carter, 84, of Terrell, Texas, passed away peacefully March 6, 2026. He was born in Ehrhardt, South Carolina, on April 16, 1941, to Charlie and Della Carter, as the 18th of 23 children.

After graduating from high school in 1959, James moved to Dallas, Texas, where he began his working life with Tom Thumb and later with American Bakeries. In the 1980s, he began what would become a lifelong career in the trucking industry, lasting 33 years. Over the years, he worked for Sundance, Whitfield, PIE, Ryder/PIE, and later Nations Way, before retiring. Throughout his career, he was a proud member of Teamsters Local 745.

James was a man of deep faith, strong values, and a tireless work ethic. He loved the outdoors and enjoyed hunting and fishing, but above all else, gardening and farming were in his blood. He took great pride in growing things from the ground and working with his hands.

He also leaves behind his cherished granddaughters, Tabbitha Cress and husband Nick, and Megan Etheridge.

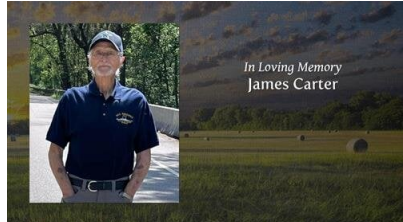

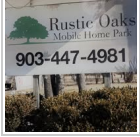
