



## James M Jones

July 1, 1939 - June 6, 2025

James “Jim” Marvin Jones passed away peacefully at his home in Mesquite on June 6, 2025. He was born on July 1, 1939, in Dallas, Texas, to Emmett and Edna Jones, whom he joyfully reunited in Heaven along with his beloved son Jeff Jones, and his cherished brother Jerry Don Jones.

Jim’s journey through life was as vibrant as the love he shared with those around him. Graduating from Terrell High School in 1958, after spending his formative years in the Red Oak community, he discovered the love of his life, Jane Harwell, during those golden high school days. From the moment he laid eyes on her, he knew his heart had found its home. They married in 1959, embarking on a lifelong adventure together.

From 1962 to 1966, Jim proudly served in the Air Force, working as a Nurses Technician on the psychiatric floor. There, he supported soldiers of all ranks as they navigated through emotional and psychological challenges brought on by the Vietnam War. His decision to join the Air Force was rooted in his commitment to sharing every moment of life’s journey with Jane, ensuring their travels were hand in hand.

In 1967, Jim and his family planted roots in Mesquite, where he dedicated nine years to Texas Instruments before joining Baylor University Medical Center. There, he worked as a unit manager and eventually as assistant manager in the distribution center until retiring in his sixties. Throughout his career, Jim brought care, diligence and a quiet strength to every role he undertook.

Jim’s enthusiasm for yardwork was unmatched. His meticulous attention to detail turned mowing, edging and tending into an art form, earning him the self-proclaimed title of “best yard in the neighborhood.” He took immense pride in his grass and wasn’t shy about letting folks know if they dared disturb his tranquil masterpiece. His love for gardening wasn’t confined to his own yard; he also worked alongside his grandfather, Jim Wallace, to landscape at Alexander Hospital. When his grandfather passed, Jim ensured the family carried on the work, turning their efforts into a lasting tribute.

Above all, Jim was a family man. His grandchildren lit up his life, and though he didn’t particularly care for the name “Marvin,” he embraced the affectionate “Paw Paw Marvin” with open arms. He was playful, generous and charismatic, a soul who never met a stranger and always found time to express gratitude to others. He had an extraordinary

way of honoring military service, often pausing to thank both the men and their wives — the latter for the sacrifices they made alongside their loved ones.

Jim's life was a tapestry of love, kindness and devotion, woven together by the countless moments he shared with family, friends and those he encountered. His legacy is one of joy, resilience and a heart that truly never stopped giving.

Left to honor and remember his legacy is his beautiful wife, Jane Jones; his children: Janet Harris and husband, James, and Jason Jones and wife, Rhonda; grandchildren: Jennifer Smith and husband Kameron, Jeffrey Harris, Ross Jones and wife Annie, and Rebekah Jones; great grandchildren: McKinley, Paisley, and Everley; sisters: Rose Wolfe and Linda Clark; brother, Grant Harwell and wife, Rosemary as well as numerous nieces, nephews, extended family and many friends, all of whom will miss Jim dearly.

Services for James will be held at 12:00 p.m., Friday, June 13, 2025, at the Max Slayton Funeral Chapel in Terrell Texas, with an interment to Highland Memorial Gardens in Terrell, Texas. The family will receive friends one hour prior to service time.

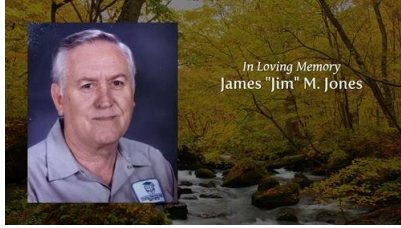
