Camping trips, boating adventures, and skiing excursions were hallmarks of their family life. Larry taught his daughters to ski, instilling in them a lifelong appreciation for the lake. Even in the dead of winter, he would build custom sleds for his girls, ensuring that their joy knew no season.

Larry's unwavering love for his family was evident in everything he did. Moving to Texas in 1971, though difficult, brought him closer to his brother Tom. When asked about the most important thing in life, Larry without hesitation answered, "family."

A skilled metal fabricator by trade, Larry possessed a unique artistic flair. He transformed ordinary objects into extraordinary works of art, finding beauty in the mundane. His passion for creation led him to become a regular at the scrap yard, his personal treasure trove.

Larry's generosity extended beyond his family. He delighted in helping friends with their projects, whether it was fixing a broken appliance, welding anything that needed (or sometimes didn't need) fixing, or building a new structure.

With the support of his family and friends, Larry and Mary Lou built their dream home on the lake. The neighborhood became his second family, and he found great joy in watching the children play on the playground he had built in his front yard. For over twenty years, he hosted a monthly poker game that brought together a special group of people that were very dear to him.

Larry was the most wonderful father anyone could ask for. His love, guidance, and support will be deeply missed. If Larry were here, he would say, "I knew I wasn't man enough to have both money and family, so I chose family."

Larry leaves his legacy to be cherished by his wife, Mary Louise Strohm; children: Kathy Chapman (Tommy), Karen Wade (Charles), Shelly Wooten (Tommy), Sandy Hamm (Stan), Nancy Grigsby (Keith); 17 grandchildren; 31 great grandchildren; 1 great-great grandson; sisters: Joyce Haugan, Peg Bognanno (Mario); brother, Tom Strohm (Sandy), as well as many other beloved extended family and friends, each of whom will dearly miss Larry.

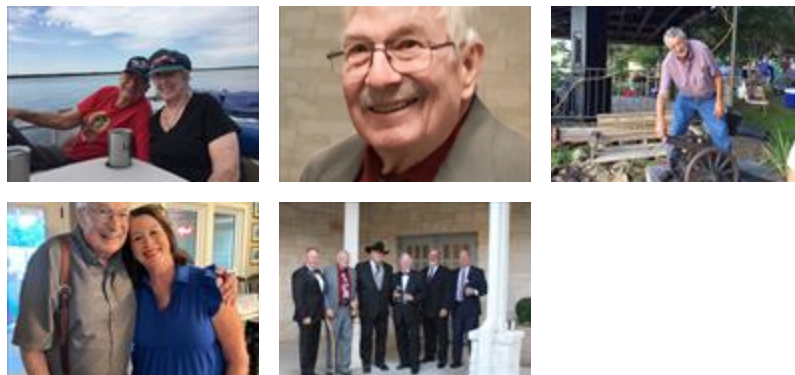
