He would share with us Veterans stories and all would talk about everything. Even though Mike wasn't a good speller he was gifted and talented in not only street knowledge, from life experience but most anything you can think of to wonder about, if I has a question about almost anything he was my go to. He was always willing to help me as needed. When the electric went out on a cold icy night he would be up early daylight to reset breaker box or whatever was needed immediately*

*for me. During the holidays Mike would come over and eat with me and David and occasional rides together to the casino he had all kinds of suggestions for my five cent bet. We both loved our dogs. My pup died after 13 years then occasionally I would keep Pinky, his dog. He was struggling but continued to keep his buddy until the VA did a biopsy on his liver. I was there that day and the Biopsy wasn't a success, probably a new intern but from that time on Pinky was with me and Mike was in and out of the hospital many times. The cancer was not in his lungs now but in his lymph nodes and liver. Chris, his son came and took care of Mike and I respected him for the great care he gave his dad.*

*Through this I made a new friend, Chris so good comes with bad. Pinky was and is a strong dog and at my age could drag me away so I could not continue to keep him so thank you Chris for taking him into your home. R.I.P. Mike.*
