



Rev. Norman Huneycutt

January 6, 1936 - June 19, 2024

Rev. Norman Huneycutt, of Terrell, passed away peacefully into the presence of his Lord and Savior, whom he had served so faithfully, on the morning of June 19, 2024.

Norman Nuel Huneycutt was born Jan. 6, 1936, in Dallas County, Arkansas to Robert and Edna Huneycutt, both of whom preceded him into the Gates of Heaven along with his brother Carl Huneycutt, nephew Greg Huneycutt, and grandson, Miles Christensen.

At a young age, Norman realized he had a servant's heart, and he would embark on a life of service to his fellow man as he surrendered to the Call of the Lord and began his ministry here on Earth. Norman was ordained as a Presbyterian Pastor and began his ministry at Grace Presbytery in Dallas and First Presbyterian Church in Terrell. He also held many elected and appointed positions with several charitable, civic, business and benevolent associations. His ability to recognize how to impact others for the better was a testament to Norman's steadfast faith and trust in God and His Sovereign grace. A man who made every endeavor an action that would only bring glory to the Lord, Norman will be greatly missed and forever remembered.
