Patricia Ann Jones Halladay, formerly of Terrell, passed away on Jan. 31, 2026. She was born December 14, 1947 in Dallas, Texas to her parents, Bert Hilliard Roberts and Bonita Turner Roberts, at the old St. Paul's Hospital. At that time, the total hospital bill for both mom and baby for a week was \$69.00! She grew up in "the hood" of Pleasant Grove in Dallas with her parents, her brothers Charles (Nell) and Hal (Susan) Roberts, and an extended family of aunts, uncles, and cousins, who were very close, making wonderful memories. At 16, her family "moved on up" to far North Dallas. She graduated Mt. St. Michael High School in Dallas and attended North Texas State University. She thoroughly loved the 17 years she worked at Forney Engineering in Carrollton as well as her time working at the Hiding Place Antiques and as co-owner of the London Market. She enjoyed cooking, reading, antiquing, making children's furniture, and she never met an animal she didn't like. Her mother used to say that as a child, she literally "loved the baby ducks and chickens to death" that she won at the State Fair. She was extremely patriotic, known to cry at parades, and loving to place her hand over her heart when reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. After moving to Terrell in her later years, she developed close friendships with her "Thursday Night Girls." She dearly loved these women, as well as the good people at the Ables Springs Café, the Waffle House, and the Ables Springs Volunteer Fire Department, who never failed to check on her if she was not feeling well. She was especially grateful for her friendship with the late Vivian and Jerry Yates,

both of whom she cherished.

Pat raised her children, Julie Schroeder Kuhns and Brandon Jones in Carrollton, where she accepted Jesus Christ as her Savior. Her "secret child," Bobbi Jo Edwards, was placed for adoption as an infant and grew up in Oregon.

Pat is survived by her daughter, Julie Schroeder Kuhns and husband, Darcy; son, Brandon Jones; brothers: Charles Roberts and wife, Nell and Hal Roberts and wife, Susan.
