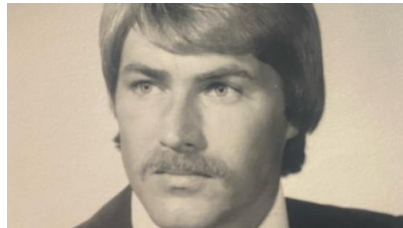

“ What I learned from my uncle bill...

I remember laughter and good times. I know his life wasn't perfect and it was probably very hard and lonely at times. But as a child all I remember is that he was always having fun and always so funny.

One of my first memories as a young girl was when we were at a family reunion at a golf course/ campground thing. I was told to go to bed while the old people carried on downstairs - laughing and telling stories. When all of a sudden there was a loud noise and a loud yell and then so much laughter! Apparently Bill had come down the stairs (or fallen) and landed in a styrofoam cooler that busted to pieces. And everyone was laughing - including him! When I asked my cousin later what happened - she said something about drinking beer and styrofoam cooler lol!

I remember his kindness and he was always happy to see me. He always made me laugh. He made me feel special.

As an adult it was the same.. whenever I saw him I was once again reminded of his kindness and love for me, and yes, his great humor! He made me laugh and made me feel special. He loved me and my husband Drew and each one of my children.

Not only did he like having fun and being funny, he had a unique character trait - - he was influenced by whoever he was around and wanted to please them. He would tell you whatever you wanted to hear - like saying - “yes I will be there next Sunday, you can count on me!” and he then didn't show up. We laughed about it often as it was just something that he did..

But thinking back on it today, makes my realize that he wanted to be

with us and everyone else around him and he just couldn't say no. He wanted to say what we wanted to hear because he loved us and didn't want to disappoint us.

He loved us and wanted to please us. He had a heart of gold. He made everyone feel special.

I will never forget near the end of his life he would often text me and say "Amy, please pray for me."

It was incredibly special to me and I considered it an honor to go to the Lord in prayer for him.

Near the end of his battle, . when things didn't go well, he was still happy and kind to those who came to see whom. And still made us feel special. .. and he definitely made us laugh! I heard all kind of crazy stories. I don't know if they were true stories or not but they made me laugh!

So to wrap it up .. what I have learned from my sweet Uncle Bill is that he made people laugh, feel special and feel loved. We could all do well to follow his example.

I will never forget his unique froggy voice saying - A-M-Y!!!! Or Amy Lynnnnnn!

And his contagious body shaking laugh will forever be etched in my brain ...and in my heart
