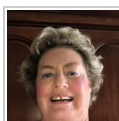
With the Lord. Love and prayers to ALL the family. I regret I did not know about her death; I would have driven from Memphis to Dallas to be there.

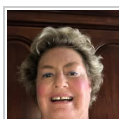
